2 Timothy 2:8-15

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David-- that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;
if we endure, we will also reign with him;
if we deny him, he will also deny us;
if we are faithless, he remains faithful--
for he cannot deny himself.

Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

Notes on the Notes

I've mentioned in previous iterations of Notes on the Notes, there is a rich tradition of blind organist-composers. One of the most prominent of these is Louis Vierne, the composer of this morning's voluntaries. The postlude is written in a textbook sonata form: it presents two contrasting themes (the exposition), elaborates on them (the development), and then repeats them in their original forms (the recapitulation).
