THE FIRST READING ACTS 1:1-11

Lector A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. NOTES ON THE NOTES:

Today's music includes Mozart's Orgelsolomesse, so named for the solo organ part in its Benedictus. In addition to this mass, the orchestra will perform two of Mozart's Church Sonatas as the prelude and postlude. Mozart's Church Sonatas (or "Epistle Sonatas") are single-movement pieces that are intended to be performed between the Epistle and Gospel readings (where we now sing the sequence hymn).

Today's anthems are both settings of quintessential Ascension texts: *God is gone up* by Gerald Finzi and Luca Marenzio's *O Rex gloriae*. In the latter piece, Marenzio incorporates some rather obvious text-painting in the form of long ascending scales with the words "super omnes coelos ascendisti."
