THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

Said by all, standing

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Notes on the Notes: While the gentlemen of the choir were working on Durufle's *Messe cum jubilo* (which they sang last Sunday), the ladies have been hard at work on Britten's Missa brevis. Britten completed the Missa brevis on Trinity Sunday (today's feast) in 1959 for the choir of Westminster Cathedral. It was written to celebrate the retirement of Westminster Cathedral's then-Director of Music, George Malcolm.

The Gloria is based on the incipit (the opening phrase) of the plainsong Gloria XV. The Sanctus is based on a twelve-tone row (a musical idea that uses all twelve chromatic pitches) that evokes the chaotic joy of church bells. The organ part of the Agnus Dei has two distinctive ideas: a pedal ostinato (or repeating pattern) and chords which sound like a train whistle.
