
# May this Christmas bring you tidings of good news and great joy tonight and throughout the year!







THE GOSPEL LUKE 2:1-20

# Glory to you, Lord Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

#### THE SERMON

#### THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord;





**POSTLUDE** 

Final from Symphonie No. 1, Op. 14

Notes on the Notes: This evening's prelude consists of three Christmas carols interspersed with Christmas organ pieces by German Romantic composers. Reger's Weihnachten (meaning "Christmas") is an enigmatic piece. Unusually for the season, it is dark and murky, but an understanding of its thematic content sheds light on why. The piece is based on three German melodies: the Advent song Es kommt ein Schiff, geladen ("A ship is coming, laden") and the Christmas hymns Vom Himmel hoch ("From heaven above") and Stille Nacht ("Silent night"). The transition from Advent to Christmas songs is mirrored by a transition from a gloomy opening, representing the roughness of the world before the Incarnation, to a beautifully tranquil ending in which Reger very cleverly combines Vom Himmel hoch and Stille Nacht.

George Malcolm's *Missa ad Praesepe*, or "Mass at the Crib," is perhaps the quintessential mass setting for Christmas. George Malcolm was music director of Westminster Cathedral from 1947-1959, and was also a notable pianist, harpsichordist, organist, and conductor. The piece follows a clever tonal scheme. The Kyrie (which we are not singing tonight) is in D-flat major, the Gloria is an enharmonic minor third higher in E major, the Sanctus is another minor third higher in G major, the Benedictus is another minor third higher in B-flat, and then the Agnus is another enharmonic minor third higher in C-sharp minor, eventually shifting from minor to major to end in D-flat major, the key in which the work began. Put plainly, each movement ascends by a third until it comes full circle by arriving at the initial key.

If you are sad that the Christmas season is concluding, fear not! On January 4th at 4 pm, we will have Twelfth Night, a service of Epiphany lessons and carols (followed by Burning of the Greens and s'mores), and on Tuesday, January 6th, we will have an Epiphany eucharist at 7 pm. We hope you will join us for these additional holiday services!
