## THE GOSPEL

JOHN 10:1-10

*Deacon* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

*People* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

**J**esus said, “Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers.” Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, “Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”

## THE SERMON

### THE NICENE CREED

**Notes on the Notes:** William Harris was music director of St. George's Windsor and a music tutor to Queen Elizabeth II in her princess years. *His Flourish for an Occasion* is an example of a popular English genre which some call "English march form." This form consists of a rousing A section, a lyrical B section, a return of the A section, and then a reprise of the B section, but this time transformed into the piece's triumphant climax. The most famous example of this form is the ubiquitous graduate piece, Elgar's *Pomp and Circumstance No. 1*.

*Collegium Regale*, often colloquially shortened to "Coll Reg," is Latin for "King's College" and indicates that a piece was written for the choir of King's College, Cambridge. Not surprisingly, numerous pieces by different composers have this designation, such as today's communion service by Harold Darke.

Today's offertory anthem is Parry's *My soul, there is a country*. This is the first of his *Six Songs of Farewell*, one of the masterpieces of twentieth-century choral music. Parry wrote these pieces during World War I; sadly, he died one month before the armistice was signed.

We are very fortunate and grateful to have Dr. Maxine Thévenot as this weekend's guest conductor. Dr. Thévenot is an organist, conductor, choir clinician, and composer based in Albuquerque, NM, where she serves as Director of Music at St. John's Episcopal Cathedral. She is also on faculty at University of New Mexico and is the Founding and Artistic Director of *Polyphony: Voices of New Mexico*, the state's first professional resident vocal ensemble. Join us at evensong today as Dr. Thévenot leads the Trinity Choir in more wonderful sacred music.
