## Meet today's organist

The Rev. Dr. Keith Hearnsberger has been serving in various ministries since he was 16. As a church musician, he grew up playing the piano and organ and pursued his college education in music. He holds the Bachelor of Arts in Music, Master of Secondary Education, and the Doctor of Education from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. He also holds the Master of Music from Arkansas State University. He entered Lexington Theological Seminary, and in 2016 graduated with the Certificate in Pastoral Care. After much discernment, he entered into Bexley-Seabury Seminary in Chicago for a year of Anglican Studies to become an Episcopal priest. After a 14 year career in education, he now works for the State of Arkansas as a Disability Claims adjudicator with the Social Security Administration. He is currently serving as organist/ choirmaster at St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Little Rock where he also serves as a transitional deacon. He is a member of the American Choral Directors Association, Arkansas Choral Directors Association, and Texas Choral Directors Association. Serving as youth choirmaster at Trinity 2003-2005, he is honored to return to the Cathedral and share a little bit of reflective organ music in this holy season.
