Installation of Sixth Head of Episcopal Collegiate School

Consequently we have and will continue to be in further conversations with the Bishop about re-opening the nationwide search process, and the next steps the committee and the Vestry will take.



Stewardship Sunday on October 11th



Please join us on Sunday, October 11th to celebrate Stewardship Sunday at Trinity Cathedral. On that day we will bless the collected pledges of financial stewardship to support the Cathedral in 2016. We will also have a special guest preacher for the service, The Very Rev. Barkley Stuart Thompson.

The Very Rev. Barkley Stuart Thompson is the eighth dean and twentieth rector of Christ Church Cathedral. He experiences his priesthood primarily as a call to preach and teach, and he is passionate about urban, downtown ministry. Born and raised in Paragould, Ark., he has roots throughout the south, including family connections to Houston and to the Cathedral. He is married to Jill, and they have two children, Griffin and Eliza.

Prior to his arrival in Houston, Barkley served as rector of St. John's Episcopal Church in Roanoke, Va., from 2007-2013 and as rector of the Church of the Holy Apostles in Collierville, Tenn., (a suburb of Memphis) from 2003-2007. St. John's is a historic, downtown congregation with a long tradition of community leadership and service. The flagship parish sponsors ministries for urban youth, the poor and the mentally disabled. Holy Apostles grew as a "restart parish" from 40 to over 400 members and constructed the first new Episcopal church in West Tennessee in over a decade.

Barkley is an avid writer and has published essays in The American Journal of Philosophy and Theology, The Journal of Pastoral Theology, The Anglican Digest, The Living Church, and Ratherview. He also preaches around the country, most recently in Montgomery, Ala., and at the "Men on Fire" preaching series at Christ Church in Greenwich, Conn. Barkley earned a Bachelor of Arts in philosophy and religion, magna cum laude, from Hendrix College; a Master of Arts in religious studies from the University of Chicago; and a Master of Divinity from the Seminary of the Southwest in Austin, where he currently serves on the Board of Trustees.

Eric Metaxas is the author of the New York Times #1 Bestseller, Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy. Named "Book of the Year" by the ECPA, Bonhoeffer also won the 2011 John C. Pollock Award for Biography awarded by Beeson Divinity School and a 2011 Christopher Award in the Non-fiction category. Called a "biography of uncommon power," Bonhoeffer appeared on numerous 2010 "Best of the Year" lists and was featured in the Wall Street Journal, Publishers Weekly, The New Republic, Harper's, Kirkus (starred review), NPR, FoxNews, C-SPAN's Book TV, Christianity Today, The Weekly Standard, and First Things. Bonhoeffer has sold more than 700,000 copies and has been translated into 17 languages. It was recently ranked #21 on the Amazon.com listing of Most Highlighted Books of all time. ABC News has called Metaxas a "photogenic, witty ambassador for faith in public life," and The Indianapolis Star described him as "a Protestant version of William F. Buckley."

Metaxas was the keynote speaker at the 2012 National Prayer Breakfast in Washington DC, an event attended by the President and First Lady, the Vice President, members of Congress, and other U.S. and world leaders. Previous keynote speakers have included Mother Theresa, Bono, and Tony Blair. That speech and Eric's essay on the experience, were put into a book, No Pressure, Mr. President: The Power of True Belief in a Time of Crisis.

Metaxas will be speaking at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral on his latest book, Miracles: What they are, Why they happen, and How they can change your life. Metaxas is made possible by generous donations from Ben & Walter Hussman, Julie & Chris Keller, the Arkansas Democrat Gazette, Terri & Chuck Erwin, Jonann & Chip Chiles and Bill Dillard III.

<u>The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Corner</u> (Children's Formation/Sunday School)



We are going to start a series of notes and information for parents and others on the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program which is the basis of our children's formation program. We will try and answer questions that you may be struggling with.

Prayer with Children – How can I pray with my child? I feel so uncomfortable because I don't know what to do!

*There are many ways to pray! Silence, singing, drawing, writing, dancing, taking a walk or sitting outside as prayer, praying together, praying alone, praying in your heart (silently), thanking God, praising God, saying how much we love God. The natural prayer of children (3-6) is thanksgiving and praise to God, i.e. "Thank you God! I love you, God! Thanks for all the people and animals in the world. Thank you for my Mommy and Daddy..." etc. The natural prayer of older children (7+) tends to be more relational with other people, i.e. "I pray for my grandmother. I pray for everybody in the whole world. God bless homeless people. I pray for peace."

*Set aside a place in your home for a candle you will light when you pray together. Gradually add other things to your prayer supplies, like: a beautiful cloth, a candle snuffer, a Bible, a Prayer Book, something beautiful from nature, pictures of people we love, a cross, prayer beads, etc.

We'll continue with more ideas and suggestions next month. In the meantime, please remember our children's formation program is ready and waiting for your child. We miss them when they are not there and we always have room for someone new.

During the first quarter of this school year, the Arts Outreach Program will focus on taking LRPA students on field trips and hosting one-time activities in each of the core arts areas listed above. We hope to expose students to these areas and more in the coming weeks. Current ideas include trips to the Arkansas Art Center, Repertory Theater, UALR Opera Theater, Oxford American, Arkansas Festival Ballet, and Muppets Music and Dance exhibit at the Clinton Children's Library. We are focusing on these core areas but also want to offer periphery courses. For instance, after a survey of LRPA Arts Outreach Students was conducted, we found out that two of the kids' favorite classes last quarter were "creative movement: "poi" (see pictures below) and "kids yoga". Additionally we learned that the kids wanted to learn to cook and do other hands-on activities more than anything else this year!

Now we need your help. We need more ideas and volunteers for field trips in the first quarter as well as ideas about how to build each of the core arts areas in the coming months. Please join us for an evening of brainstorming in Morrison Hall on Tuesday, September 29th, from 5-8pm. We will provide refreshments and inspiration, we hope you will bring all of your ideas.

As we start the 2015-2016 program year for the LR Prep TEC Arts Outreach Program we want to share with you some very exciting news:


