INSIGHTS PRESENTS: An Evening with Elaine Pagels



April 2 at 6:30 p.m.: The Theological Enrichment Committee Presents INSIGHTS: An Evening with Elaine Pagels. We are pleased to offer our third installment in our INSIGHTS Series for 2015-2016!

Elaine Pagels joined the Princeton faculty in 1982, shortly after receiving a MacArthur Fellowship. Perhaps best known as the author of The Gnostic Gospels, The Origin of Satan, and Adam, Eve and the Serpent, she has published widely on Gnosticism and early Christianity, and continues to pursue research interests in late antiquity. Her most recent books include Beyond Belief: The Secret Gospel of Thomas (was on the New York Times best-seller list) and Reading Judas: The Gospel of Judas and the Shaping of Christianity, co-authored with Karen King of Harvard. Her current project is working on a book entitled Revelations, which will explore the New Testament Book of Revelation and other Jewish,

Christian, and Pagan books of Revelation written around the same time. She will be speaking on Beyond Belief – The Secret Gospel of Thomas. The Rev. Canon Dr. J. Russel Snapp will lead a book study beginning on March 8. Pagels is made possible by a generous donation from the Cindy Bost Wellness Trust. General Admission tickets are free, but require a ticket. More on Rituals

- Keep rituals simple and short. The younger the child, the shorter the ritual. Gather a few items to symbolize the occasion (the first lost tooth, a picture of the one who has died, something special from around the house, or encourage y our child to find something in nature, or invite the child to draw a picture). This, with a candle and a quiet corner will be enough. The items are not the focus. The items should be "transparent" pointing beyond themselves toward the occasion.
- Lead the first ritual yourself. Bur for every subsequent ritual, let your child help plan and take part in everything.
- Rituals may consist of: silence, singing, praying, reading something aloud, holding hands and sitting in a circle, sharing memories, making up a dance, making up body movements to a repeated prayer sentence (like "God, we thank you!" or Lord, hear our prayer"), taking a ceremonial walk somewhere outside, into another room, around the room. Choose 2 or 3 components. Make the plan. Have the ritual. You can't go wrong if your motivation is to set aside this occasion as special, having the desire to acknowledge God's presence with us in
