
Coming in June: Dr. Lisa Corry as Director of Ministries to Children and Youth

Ascension Day and the Rogation Days

The Book of Common Prayer (p. 15) lists Ascension Day as one of the seven Principal Feasts of the Church year. Few Episcopalians observe it, however, mainly because it always falls on a Thursday, forty days after Easter Day. St. Luke, in the sequel to his gospel known as the Acts of the Apostles, tells us that the risen Christ ascended into heaven forty days after the Resurrection, after he had appeared to the disciples numerous times in his glorified body, showing them his hands and his side. The Church has always seen this transition as a victory in which embodied humanity was joined with divinity, without the limitations of earthly life. As one Ascension hymn puts it, "Thou hast raised our human nature on the clouds to God's right hand: there we sit in heavenly places, there with thee in glory stand. Jesus reigns, adored by angels; Man with God is on the throne; mighty Lord, in thine ascension, we by faith behold our own." (Hymnal 1982, #215, verse 3)

This year, the feast of the Ascension falls on Thursday, May 25. We will celebrate it on Wednesday, May 24, at the 5:05 service, on the eve of the feast. By the way, the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday leading up to Ascension Day are known as Rogation days, from the Latin *rogare*, which means "to ask" or "to pray." These are days when the risen Christ is especially invoked to bless the world around us, including newly planted crops and all institutions that serve human needs.

Are you interested in learning more about EfM? The Trinity Cathedral group will be taking new members starting next August. Education for Ministry (EfM) is a unique four-year distance learning certificate program in theological education based upon small-group study and practice. Since its founding in 1975, this international program has assisted more than 80,000 participants in discovering and nurturing their call to Christian service. EfM helps the faithful encounter the breadth and depth of the Christian tradition and bring it into conversation with their experiences of the world as they study, worship, and engage in theological reflection together. For more information, please visit the EfM website.

This is a four year program administered by the School of Theology at Sewanee. In each year you take a deep dive into a particular area - Old Testament, New Testament, Christian History, and Personal Theology. We meet weekly on Wednesday evenings from August to May, and there is a significant bit of reading each week. There is also an annual cost of \$350 that covers your reading materials.

Our meeting time is spent with some fellowship time, a brief discussion of the readings, and then a facilitated discussion called a theological reflection. Our focus as a group is going to be on theological reflection. The reading is important to build your knowledge of Christian tradition to feed these discussions, but it is not as overwhelming as many might think. If you're too busy to read on some weeks, you'll still want to attend for the discussions.


