



Evensong Service

Evensong is Sundays at 4:00 p.m. This sung service of Evening Prayer offers music in praise of God by the Cathedral Schola choir. It begins with an organ prelude (there is no sermon) and ends with an elegant tea in Baker Parlor.

Pentecost and Confirmation

Bishop Larry Benfield will preside, preach, and offer the sacramental rite of Confirmation at Trinity Cathedral on June 4, the Feast of Pentecost. This is one of the most significant dates in the church calendar. It commemorates how, fifty days after Jesus's Resurrection (Easter), the Holy Spirit descended on his disciples. They then went from fearful, guilt-ridden hiding to hopeful, bold proclamation of the good news throughout the world. The feast of Pentecost is therefore often considered as the birthday of the Church and its mission. In the English-speaking world, it is also known as Whitsunday, after the white garments worn by candidates baptized on that day. (In England, baptism often occurred then because the weather was still considered too chilly for baptism at Easter.) The color of the day, however, is red, which symbolizes the fire of the Spirit.

On the Day of Pentecost this year, ten will be confirmed at Trinity and one will reaffirm his faith. Confirmations will take place at both of the main services. Also, at the 9 o'clock service, we will dedicate a newly commissioned Pentecostal altar frontal given by Dr. Ann Hedge-Carruthers in loving memory of her husband, the Rev. Dr. Robert Cooper.

Full Breakfast Every Sunday Morning and Supper Every Wednesday Night

We will serve breakfast from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings in Morrison Hall and supper on Wednesday evenings from 5:15 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. The price per person is \$7.00 for adults and \$4.00 for children under 12. Education for Ministry (EfM) is a unique four-year distance learning certificate program in theological education based upon small-group study and practice. Since its founding in 1975, this international program has assisted more than 80,000 participants in discovering and nurturing their call to Christian service. EfM helps the faithful encounter the breadth and depth of the Christian tradition and bring it into conversation with their experiences of the world as they study, worship, and engage in theological reflection together. This is a four year program administered by the School of Theology at Sewanee. In each year you take a deep dive into a particular area - Old Testament, New Testament, Christian History, and Personal Theology. We meet weekly on Wednesday evenings from August to May, and there is a significant bit of reading each week. There is also an annual cost of \$350 that covers your reading materials.

Our meeting time is spent with some fellowship time, a brief discussion of the readings, and then a facilitated discussion called a theological reflection. Our focus as a group is going to be on theological reflection. The reading is important to build your knowledge of Christian tradition to feed these discussions, but it is not as overwhelming as many might think. If you're too busy to read on some weeks, you'll still want to attend for the discussions.



Music Notes from Jason



In last Sunday's Gospel according to John, we heard our Lord explain, "This is the Spirit of truth...You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. I will not leave you orphaned." What a peculiar statement this seems! Where is our Lord going? And how is it that, if he leaves us, we will nonetheless not be alone, not orphans? Foretelling his ascension into heaven, he has a plan for us, which will be fulfilled on the great day of Pentecost, the day we come at length to realize that orphans we are not, and left alone we are not. It is on this day when the Advocate, the Comforter, is sent to be with us always: the Holy Spirit, the life-giving spirit of God, indeed God himself, who enlivens our being, makes belief possible, strengthens our faith, and inspires and empowers us to spread the Gospel message. Such an important day this is for the disciples and the Mother of our Lord, wondering whether they had been left behind, abandoned by Jesus, gathered in that place on the first Pentecost

two millennia ago, when a great wind swirled about them, and the Spirit appeared upon them as tongues of fire, an outward sign of a promise fulfilled: God has created us, Jesus has redeemed us, and the Holy Spirit enlivens us and makes us his own. And so the Church commemorates this day, considered by many the very birth of the Church herself. This Pentecost Sunday at Trinity Cathedral, we mark the Feast with special music that relays the magnificent, fiery spark of the Creator God. We welcome the Pinnacle Brass who will play with the organ to accompany our congregational hymns and who will offer brilliant repertoire at the prelude and postlude. The anthem for the day will be Ralph Vaughan Williams' beloved "O clap your hands," whose text is taken from Psalm 47: "O clap your hands, all ye people, shout unto God with the voice of triumph!" Our nave will resound with the triumphal strains of trumpet and horn, voice and organ on this day of days. Our Jesus who once was dead, who arose, and who has ascended to the right hand of the Father, has now sent from heaven upon us his Holy Spirit, such an unfathomable, inestimable, if not utterly incomprehensible gift to us. With this sending of the Spirit, we are indeed not left orphaned, but rather, we have become children of God, adopted by the Most High into the mystery of the Trinitarian life. Our song for ever shall be Veni, Sancte Spiritus: "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love." The Music Department of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral wish you all the richest of blessings for Pentecost.

This camp aims to provide a healthy balance between work and play.

Choir Camp is hosted each year by Subiaco Abbey and Academy, in Subiaco, Arkansas. Excellent amenities including air-conditioned dorms and rehearsal halls, Olympic-sized pool, beautiful countryside and grounds, and an exceptionally beautiful church and pipe organ all help facilitate the lessons, worship, and recreational activities (including swimming, games, arts & crafts, movies and dances) during camp.

The camp is open to students who have completed 3rd grade up through those in the 12th grade. No prior choral experience or membership in a choir is necessary. Only a love of singing and music is required.


