



CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD – CHILDREN'S FORMATION



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd – Children's Formation Our Sunday morning programs are off to a great start. The Level 1 Atrium (3 year olds-1st grade) continues to work with practical life skills and getting into a routine in the atrium. While these lessons are not explicitly religious, they help set the stage for prayerful work throughout the year.

lessons are not explicitly religious, they help set the stage for prayerful work throughout the year. Here are some additional reasons we work with practical life – maybe you can incorporate some of them into tasks at home.

<u>Practical life develops fine motor control.</u> This allows the children to work with satisfaction on all the materials of the atrium.

<u>Practical life develops the child's work cycle.</u> Choosing a work and a place to do it, carrying the work to the chosen table or mat, repeating the work until satisfied, and returning the work to the shelf ready to be used again is a pattern used for every material in the atrium. As this is established children put away work and choose their next activity with more independence.

<u>Practical life develops language</u>. Each material and its components have names. Each exercise has particular movements. This language is introduced and used by the catechist, developing a precise vocabulary for work in the atrium and life in the church.

<u>Practical life develops community</u>. As these exercises are used children are also learning to work without disturbing each other, to wait patiently to use a material another child has chosen, to move around the room quietly and carefully, and to make sure each material is put away and ready to be used by next child.

Level 2 - Second and third graders, many who are new to the True Vine Atrium, have adjusted well to a new Sunday morning routine that begins each week with them conducting their own prayer service. We started the year with a couple of lessons and conversations centered on Holy Eucharist, and we are looking forward to inviting a special guest speaker into our atrium to talk more about the symbolism connected to this sacrament. Just last week, the children steered our discussion toward the Bible -- where it came from, who wrote it, how different translations may use different words to deliver the same message. Their questions, insights and desire to learn more was empowering!

Level 3 - the 4th and 5th graders have been studying our Time Line chart from Creation to Parousia, particularly considering the gifts God has given us. With God's particular gift to us of the human hand, people have discovered or invented what they needed. With the most basic stone tools and the wheel, cultivation of crops, inventing language, art and math to the most complex electronics today, we have discovered how our communities and even civilizations have shared particular gifts and forged relationships. We will continue discerning how our individual gifts and those of our church can be transformed by God and contribute to God's dream of one community, one nation, one world.

We are having a great time. Please join us in the atria – it is never too late to begin nurturing your child's spiritual journey.

CATHEDRAL CHRISTMAS PAGEANT



This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Cathedral Christmas Pageant, a rich and beloved tradition at Trinity, instituted in 1957 by Dean Charles A. Higgins. Presented by the children and youth of the parish, the service is delivered in a format similar to Lessons & Carols and recounts the events leading up to and immediately following Jesus' birth. It is a lovely portrayal of the Nativity and quite moving for participants and congregants alike. This year's Christmas Pageant will be presented on Sunday, December 17 at 4 p.m.

All children and youth who are active in Trinity's choir and/or Christian Formation programs will be cast in the Pageant. A cast list will be posted on All Saints' Day along with a rehearsal schedule for blocking and speaking parts. Ms. Victoria and Mr. Jason have already begun rehearsing the music with the children during weekly choir practices.

In addition, back by popular demand, we will host a two-morning Pageant Workshop on Monday, November 20 and Tuesday, November 21 for all participants who are able to attend. Because so many of our children are out of school Thanksgiving week, this offers a great opportunity for us to work on the Pageant! Last year's workshop was a huge success -- providing needed rehearsal time, a creative outlet for our children and a convenient service for working parents. The program will meet from 9 a.m. to noon on both days which will blend rehearsals with seasonal fun!


