### Ash Wednesday Services

Ash Wednesday Services will be held on Wednesday, February 14 at 7:30 a.m., 12:15 p.m., and 6:30 p.m. There will be no Wednesday night classes or music rehearsals meeting on this day.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. According to the Book of Common Prayer, Ash Wednesday is a special day of devotion that may be observed by special acts of devotion or self-denial. As we mark this special day, we are offering services with the imposition of ashes throughout the day. This provides accessibility before work/school, at lunch, or in the evening.

At the 6:30 p.m. service (the only service of the day with music), the Cathedral Choir will sing Allegri's famous "Miserere". It was composed during the reign of Pope Urban VIII during the 1630s for use in the Sistine Chapel as part of the Ash Wednesday service. The text is Psalm 51 "Have mercy on me O Lord". The anthem is written for double choir and is an excellent example of late Renaissance polyphony.

The major aspect of Ash Wednesday is to help us call to mind our mortality and be confronted with both the shortness and the uncertainty of this life: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19-20).

### Trinity - Bethel Readings

On February 21 and 28 Dr. Keller will lead readings on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Morrison Hall from 6:15 to 7:15 p.m.

### Adult Confirmation Class to Begin February 21

Trinity's annual adult Confirmation Class will meet on Wednesdays in Lent and Eastertide this year from 6:15 to 7:15 p.m. in the Conference Room. Sessions will run from February 21 through May 16, with the exception of the Wednesday in Holy Week, which is March 28.

This class, led by the Rev. Canon Dr. Russ Snapp with assistance from other leaders of Trinity, both clergy and lay, is primarily intended for 1) baptized adults considering membership in the Episcopal Church; 2) baptized adult members who have not yet been confirmed or received by the Bishop as members of the Episcopal Church; and 3) adults desiring to be baptized, as well as confirmed, in the Episcopal Church. The class is also open to those already baptized and confirmed who wish to join others in strengthening their knowledge of the Christian faith and of our Anglican tradition, with the possibility of reaffirming their faith before the Bishop. We will celebrate Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation at the Bishop Benfield's visitation on the Day of Pentecost, which falls this year on May 20.



You're invited to a presentation and discussion with the Rev. Robert Wetherington and the Rev. Betsy Baumgarten, Co-Executive Directors of Camp Mitchell. Robert and Betsy arrived at camp almost one year ago after serving as priests in Mississippi. They bring their passion for the church along with their love of nature to Petit Jean Mountain and are excited to share it with us.
