MATTHEW 25 COMMITTEE PARISH UPDATE



The committee has been active this year with projects at Little Rock Preparatory Academy, The Stewpot, Our House and Saint Francis House.

The overwhelming support of cleaning supplies for the teachers at Little Rock Preparatory Academy was deeply appreciated by the teachers who were able to sanitize their rooms multiple times during a day in the flu and cold season. A presentation on LRPA needs will be given by Brooks Wolfe and Jean Harper in place of the Dean's class on April 29th. Please make plans to attend this important session.

The Saint Francis House has been an outreach ministry of the Diocese for fifty years and continues to provide needed services to the community and veterans. As a result of the success of Bliss, Trinity has money available to help make a difference at Saint Francis House. The decision was made by the committee to focus on helping with infrastructure and processes rather than consumable supplies. To date, Trinity has been able to partner with Saint Mark's to assist with medical copay funds for low income and elderly clients. This is \$7,000 per year from each parish over the next two years.

In addition, the clothing donation and distribution process was in need of help. A team from the committee began the process of clearing the backlog and instituting effective controls on distribution of clothing and household supplies. Coming soon will be a regular opportunity for the parish to help. **Trinity Tuesdays** will be a regularly scheduled time for our parish to staff the donation and distribution rooms. An on-line signup for volunteer times slots will soon be available.

The building was experiencing leaks and water damage around windows and doors. Trinity provided \$5,000 to repaint the bricks and stop the leaks and water damage. The seat of the delivery truck used to pick up donations was also in need of repair, and Trinity was able to replace this.

A team is assessing the client record computer systems to work toward full electronic client record keeping. More details as this assessment progresses.

The Saint Francis House donation box at Trinity was in danger of becoming a trash receptacle filled with useless items. The box as been repainted and a list of needed items s posted above. Please fill it up with gently used items.


We encourage groups to "Adopt a Vet" during their transition period into independent living. The Bell Tower adopted a female veteran with six children and were able to acquire furnishings for her new housing. Think about getting the children's formation teams, the choirs, the vestry, Young Adults, ushers and more to each take on helping one veteran get on their feet. Sign up information for your team will be posted soon.

Plans are being made for another "Dinner with the Vets", this summer. This has always been a fun event for the veterans and the parishioners who attend. More information will be sent out as the time gets closer.

The May 6th Mother's Day Purse Drive will give children at Dorcas House, Our House, and Saint Francis House presents of filled purses to give their mothers on Mother's Day. This will be the third year Trinity has held this event. Each year over one hundred purses are collected, blessed and then distributed.

The Stewpot has been the regular recipient of men's jeans, athletic shoes and underwear this year. The homeless diners who eat there regularly feel blessed to receive the shoes and jeans that you donated. This is an on-going need. Donations may be placed in the baskets at the entrance to the church or dropped off at the Cathedral office. The Trinity team cooks lunch every other Monday at Stewpot. 





CHILDREN 'S CHOIRS: May 6 is the next time our Children's Choirs lead the music in the worship. They will sing only at the 9:00 a.m. service. These children have worked hard and have made music to the glory of God. If you haven't heard and seen them in their role as worship leaders, this will be your last chance for this school year. Rehearsals will be completed with their end-of-year parties on May 9. Children's choir rehearsals will resume on September 5, 2018 and will again be on Wednesdays; 3:30 for ages 4 – 7 and 4:30 for grades 2 - 7. If you have or know children in these age groups, we have a place in a children's choir for them. Please save Wednesday afternoons when you start to plan your school year.

CONCERTS: Exciting News. We've added a Chamber Music Concert on May 24th. Our good friend and fantastic violinist Kiril Laskarov will be joined by musicians from the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra (many of whom regularly play in our worship services). They will present "Spanish Nights" a chamber concert which will premier an oboe concerto written for and performed by Beth Wheeler, a frequent instrumentalist here at Trinity. This concert will be free but given to support these musicians as they travel to Spain this summer to perform as musical ambassadors from Arkansas. Sadly, our July organ concert has been postponed until late Fall. Burton Tidwell, our recitalist and organ restorer, has come down with debilitating pneumonia and has been assigned 6 months of rest. The current plan is that he will join us in late fall for an Evensong/Recital to culminate the glorious work that he and Reggie Hulsey did on our instrument. At that time, we plan to hang our donor plaque.

SUMMER SUNDAYS ON SPRING STREET: By the time you've gotten to this paragraph, you probably know that we're planning a worship/fellowship/music festival summer schedule for Sunday Evenings. END OF SUMMER BLOWOUT: If you've never heard of a performing group called "Three on a String", I hope you 'Youtube' them or just ask your Alabama friends about them. These guys are amazing musicians who play many instruments, much of the music in bluegrass style. A member of this group, Bobby Horton, has written and performed the music for the NPR series on the Civil War. Based in Birmingham, AL, they sell out the Alabama State Theatre for their performances and are in high demand throughout the country. We are lucky enough to have them booked for August 26 when we will repeat our "Patti Griffin Experience" from last summer and link an Evensong with a fabulous concert followed by a big party/reception in Morrison.

Studies continue to support child development theorist's beliefs that experiences from ages 0-3 lay the foundation for all future learning and the best way to construct a solid foundation is through hands on play experiences which build on and reinforce previous learning. While at ECEP, our goal is to not only provide a safe, nurturing environment, but to offer a vast variety of activities daily, some weeks are just a little more special than the norm. Each year in April, early childhood educators across Arkansas, in conjunction with the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), recognize the Week of the Young Child by celebrating Arkansas Children's Week. This year the state's theme was 'Deeper Learning: Wonder, Explore, Find Out More'. Building around the STEAM concept, lessons were created for our littlest all the way to our Pre-K4 children. Each day, we focused on the unique parts of STEAM learning.

- S- Science (Simply figuring out truths about our world- sink or float, shadows, balance and gravity through block play)
- T- Technology (tools we use to figure things out and record data- paper, crayons, rulers and scales to name a few)
- E- Engineering (how things are constructed- make a plan, test it, and modify until it works)
- A- Art (using tools to create art- architecture, photography, mixed media, quilting, etc.)
- M- Mathematics (how we prove things- what is heavier, which ball rolls faster, how much has something grown)





As spring warms into summer, our semester of Arts Outreach is wrapping up. This Wednesday afternoon program is an opportunity for the 3rd-5th grade students at Little Rock Preparatory Academy to experience artistic and creative endeavors led by volunteers from Trinity and the community.
