

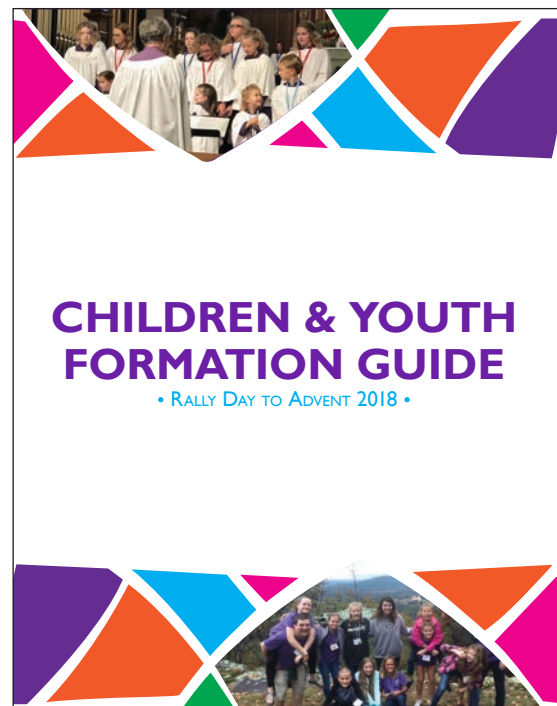
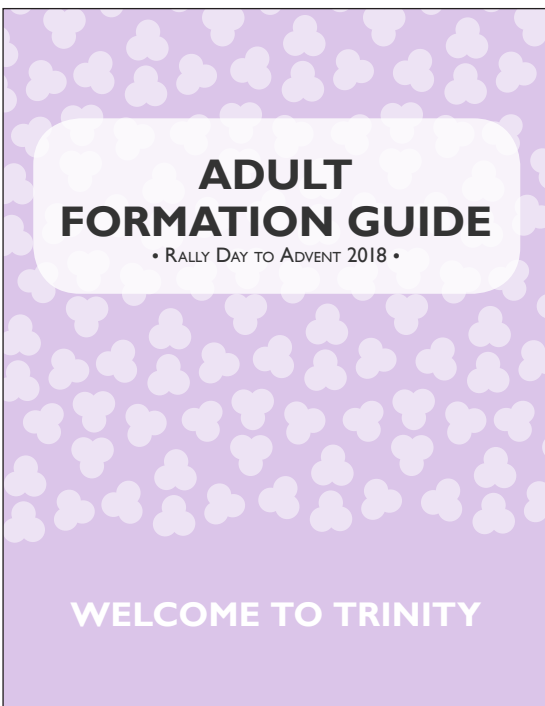

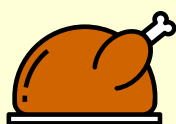

MATTHEW 25 UPDATE

Bliss – Saint Francis House Update

Saint Francis is the outreach arm of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Arkansas. Thousands of people are helped each year with food, medical services, clothing, shelter and other services. Another component provides help and shelter to veterans.

After the last Bliss event raised \$25,000 the Matthew 25 Committee was given the responsibility for determining how the monies from Bliss, and the additional \$10,000 donation from the movie company, could best be used to help Saint Francis House with their vital ministries in our community.

The committee met with the Saint Francis House leadership and developed a strategy for determining how funds would be spent. The committee decided that rather than make a blanket gift, specific projects would be undertaken to address needs that would be outside of the normal budget of Saint Francis House. As of August 2018, the following funds have been submitted to the vestry for approval and spent on needed projects:

- \$7,000 - Medical co-pay assistance program. This is a joint project with Saint Mark's whereby each parish contributes this amount for two years to assist people with obtaining needed medication.
- \$5,000 - Pointing the brickwork around windows, doors and roof line. This project stopped damaging leaks.
- \$1,068 - Chairs replaced in the Social Services waiting room. The chairs in the waiting area of the Social Services department were worn out and needed replacing. Twenty four chairs were purchased.
- \$400 - Front seat replacement for Donation Pick-up Truck. The seat in the truck used for picking up donations was completely worn out and unsafe for both driver and passenger.
- \$400 - Supplies for reorganizing the Donation Room. A major undertaking was the reorganization of the clothing room and donation processing. Under the leadership of Mary Wilson this project has made a significant impact.
- The client record keeping system was outdated and almost completely manual. With the assistance of a team from Jennifer Wilson Harvey's firm a new software system has been developed that will streamline the record keeping and make it more user friendly for the staff. This project will save untold staff work hours and record keeping costs.

Volunteers are still needed to assist with the clothing room sorting and management. Trinity Tuesdays are set aside for this and volunteers are needed in two hour blocks to help. Grab friend and make a difference.

The aid that Trinity has provided is greatly appreciated by the staff and is demonstrating that Trinity is once again stepping up in its role as a Cathedral parish and working to bring the gospel to life.

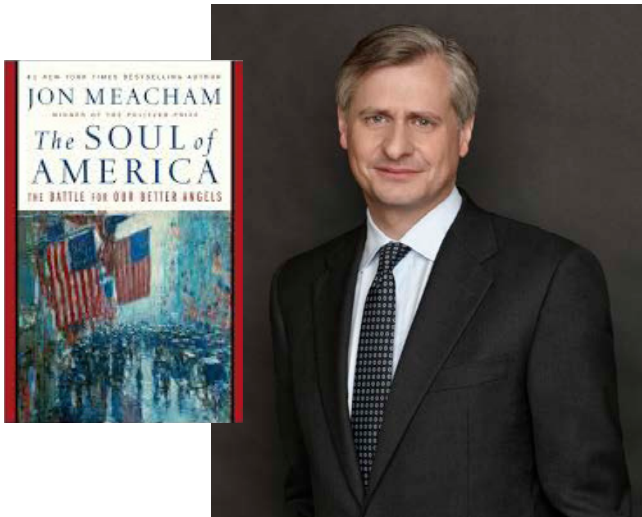

CHILDREN'S FORMATION

Beginning September 9th

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Christian Formation curriculum designed for children ages 3-12. It is grounded in scripture and liturgy, and enriched with prayer, worship and a spirit of celebration. Using Montessori techniques, the catechist (or teacher) explores Jesus' life, Kingdom Parables, Prophecies, the meaning of the words and actions of the Eucharist, ways of worship, and growing into being the church.

YOUTH FORMATION

All youth (grades 6th-12th) are invited to join for Sunday Morning Formation during which we focus on relevant topics to the church calendar and the world. This time together is guided by discussion questions and includes interaction with scripture, storytelling, reflections, and prayer.



OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Infants and Toddlers

Nursery

Children younger than 4 are welcome in the bright, sunny, well-staffed nursery. It is open from 8:30 a.m. until the end of the 11:15 a.m. service.

The nursery is also open during some other services and special events. Contact the office at (501) 372-0294 to confirm the availability at special services.

The Nursery is located in Parish House. Parish House is the building behind the Cathedral including Morrison Hall. You can walk straight across the Garth (brick courtyard) and enter the glass doors, or you can exit the Cathedral through the back doors (where the procession enters and exits) through the connecting hallway past the vesting area.

Baptism

We are delighted to offer the Sacrament of Baptism to anyone in our parish who has added a child to their family. This is a joyous occasion where the entire congregation celebrates the addition to our parish family and to the Body of Christ.

We regularly have baptisms on the days appointed for the occasion in the Book of Common Prayer:

All Saints' Sunday (November)
Baptism of Our Lord (Early January)
Easter Vigil (Spring)
Trinity Sunday (Early Summer)

Additional dates may be arranged by contacting the Parish Office. Baptism preparation for parents and godparents will be scheduled before each baptism date.



Young Children (3+ - 5th grade)

Activities

There are folders for children with crayons, paper, and children's bulletins in the baskets as you enter the church. The bulletins have pictures and activities that are related to the day's scriptures. There are also colored pencils and a variety of books on the table.

Children's Church Times

During the 9:00 a.m. service, children under the age of 6 process out of the service during the hymn before the Gospel reading and return at the passing of the Peace. They meet next door and hear the "story", sing, pray, and have an age appropriate time of worship. The lesson is led by volunteer parents and parishioners. Parents are always welcome to stay with their children during the liturgy.

Youth (6th grade - 12th grade)

EYC

The Episcopal Youth Community at Trinity is comprised of 6th-12th graders. EYC serves, forms, and empowers the transition between childhood and adulthood. We meet weekly during the school year to share meals, play games, go on retreats and outings, participate in service work, and grow together in our relationships with the church and community.

Acolytes

The Acolyte Guild is a committed community of young people who serve faithfully at our primary Sunday morning Eucharists, as well as church holidays and other special services. New acolytes are trained and commissioned in the early fall. Youth as young as 6th grade are invited to serve as acolytes.

Youth Confirmation

Confirmation is a sacramental rite in the Episcopal Church in which candidates "express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop" (BCP, p. 180). Confirmation classes for youth (12 years and older) are offered annually, beginning in the spring. These classes explore topics of Christian Faith and the Anglican Tradition. Confirmation Sunday takes place in the spring.
