LOOKING AHEAD:

"OUR SHELTER FROM THE STORMY BLAST": SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS ON 9/11

September 16th and 23rd

On two Sundays, September 16 and 23, the Rev. Stuart Hoke will address the Dean's Forum on a topic dear to all of us whose spirits were crushed in the horrific events of September 11, 2001. As a priest on staff at Trinity Church Wall Street in lower Manhattan—150 yards from the World Trade Center—Dr. Hoke was eyewitness to the events of the day and the months of recovery that followed. In these two classes, he will give a detailed account of his own experiences, as well as innumerable references to the many acts of Redemption that occurred simultaneous with the desolation and confusion.

Moments after the second plane rammed the WTC towers, Hoke conducted an extemporaneous service of worship at Trinity Church for those seeking immediate shelter and sanctuary—offering prayer, singing hymns and reading Scripture to a frightened and bewildered congregation. From that time forward he witnessed God's power at work within the devastation—bringing good out of evil, life out of death, light out of darkness, and joy out of suffering. He will also share what the congregation of Trinity Church gleaned from these experiences, learnings that apply to all of us as we navigate the 21st century—especially as members of an urban Cathedral dedicated to doing a world of good.

What is Catechesis of the Good Shepherd?

The curriculum used in our Sunday morning children's formation programs (ages 3 – 5th grade) is based on the premise that our children already have an established relationship with God. Catechesis was developed by Sofia Cavalletti, a Hebrew Scholar and theologian, in 1954. She discovered that children received the Word of God from Scripture with joy. Children want only the essential things, the big truths not watered down information. Her method seeks not to contain or explain the great mysteries of God and the Kingdom of God – instead, the mystery is encountered, explored and the face of God is sought. No learned response is then regurgitated for the teacher's satisfaction, because the Catechist (teacher) and the child are co-learners in the search for God.

Sofia encountered the work of Maria Montessori and incorporated the developmental insights and teaching methods of Montessori into her work. Montessori's work provides a "vehicle" in which to travel through the mysteries we are encountering in our relationship with the Creator God, the Redeemer God, who desires intimacy and love.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd curriculum helps the child "come close to God all by myself".

We are currently offering training for this program and are looking for volunteers in the atria beginning with 2nd grade. You do not need to be a parent to volunteer! Contact Dawn (dhowe@trinitylittlerock.org or 372-0294) if you would like to help.
