October means Stewardship!

A word about stewardship from the Dean:

A steward is someone who manages another's property or financial affairs, and in faith we hold that what we have does not belong ultimately to us, but God. This is not one of the more obvious truths or easiest teachings in Christian faith! We draw the concept from Jesus' parable of the master who went on a long journey, leaving his servants in charge of his affairs. Parables are not meant to be taken literally, but rather as stories designed to illustrate truths about ourselves and God. The kingdom of heaven is "as though I am a steward," of a master who has gone away, leaving me in charge. When I can imagine myself that way, I am dipping a toe into the waters of the kingdom of God. I have been imagining myself that way for a long time. It takes a lot of practice, but over time it begins to sink in. As it does, it colors our thinking not only about giving charitably to the church and other worthwhile endeavors, but about our lives in all their aspects, including the way we spend our time and use our talents. While not one of the easiest teachings in our faith, it is easily one of the most spiritually enriching!

STAFF TRANSITION

Sherry Stafford, long time Finance Administrator both for the Diocese and then, more recently, the Cathedral, will be leaving the Cathedral, effective October 18. Thank you, Sherry, for your long years of excellent service, professionalism, and warm-hearted good cheer!

Update on the Townsend & Brooks Wolfe Hearing Charitable Fund

To continue the philanthropic work of her late husband, Townsend, Brooks Wolfe established this foundation through the Arkansas Community Foundation to help the deaf and hard of hearing.

Since its inception fifteen months ago, she has fit 34 adults with hearing aids pro bono with fixed incomes ranging from \$860 to \$1600/month. In addition, fifteen residents of nursing homes have been fit with assistive listening devices. Classroom acoustical modifications and soundfield systems have been installed in half of the classrooms at LRPA, thereby, benefitting 140 students. Standardized testing was administered at the beginning of the school year and will be re-administered in April 2019 to determine if these classroom interventions have significantly raised the students' language scores.

Our collaborative team for serving the nursing home population is Dr. Hope Keiser and Dr. Pat Highley (retired audiologists). Our team for serving LRPA is Lenora Steinkamp (retired Kindergarten teacher), Jean Harper (volunteer reading specialist), Dr. Hope Keiser, and Beth Eaton (retired Speech language-pathologist and early language interventionist). Hearing aid fittings are a team of one!

CHILDREN & FAMILY NEWS

Last month your child(ren) entered a specially prepared environment called the ATRIUM. The Atrium is not a classroom, but can be likened to a retreat house for children.

Why is it called "Atrium" anyway? The word "atrium" actually means "portico, or porch entrance to a large house." The Atrium was a term given to this space by Maria Montessori. It was chosen because in the ancient church, the atrium was a gathering space between the Church Proper and the street. It was the place where the catechumens, those preparing for initiation to the Church, would receive instruction. The Atrium has a similar purpose for our children, as it is a place to help them enter into full, conscious and active participation in the liturgical and communal life of the Church.

What is a "prepared environment"? The prepared environment is a Montessori concept that the environment can be designed to facilitate independent learning by the child. In a prepared environment, children work with materials of their own choice and at their own pace. They experience a combination of freedom and self-discipline in a place especially prepared to meet their developmental and spiritual needs.
