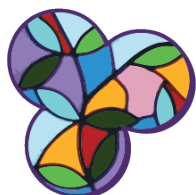

**Notes on the Notes:** Herbert Sumsion's final church post was Director of Music at Gloucester Cathedral, where he succeeded Herbert Brewer, the composer of our evening service two weeks ago. Sumsion had just accepted the directorship of Coventry Cathedral, but because of Brewer's sudden death, he was released from this contract so that he could fill the vacancy at Gloucester. Interestingly, prior to this post, Sumsion worked at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia in its infancy. Curtis is not very well-known outside of the classical music world, but it is the most competitive college in the country, offering full-tuition scholarships to all its students.
