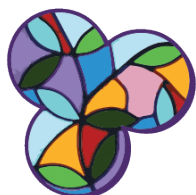

#### **Notes on the Notes:**

Today's canticles are Noble's Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in B minor – one of the greatest hits of the Anglican choral tradition. In America, Noble is known mainly for starting the choir school at St. Thomas Fifth Avenue, where he worked for 35 years. Prior to immigrating to America, he was Organist and Choirmaster of Ely Cathedral and York Minster.

William Henry Harris is another figure well known to lovers of the Anglican choral tradition, but some might be surprised to know – and as we approach the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, it seems important to note – that he was Queen Elizabeth II's music teacher during her princess days.
