N ow the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. As I looked at it closely I saw fourfooted animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. Notes on the Notes

Today's offertory anthem by Edgar Bainton takes its text from Revelation 21:1-4, today's second reading. Revelation is the final book of the bible and composes one of the primary sources on Christian eschatology, or beliefs about end-times. Far from being dark and apocalyptic, the text is an optimistic and comforting vision of "the new Jerusalem."

Like much of Maurice Duruflé's organ and choral music, *Ubi caritas* is based on Gregorian chant. While many 20th century French composers incorporated plainchant into their music, Duruflé is the undisputed master of this technique.
